Dr. Cichocki is the Social Advisor to the President of Poland and an adjunct professor in the Institute of Applied Social Sciences of the University of Warsaw (specialization: history of ideas and political philosophy). In the years 2000-2002 he lectured political sciences in the M. Wańkiewicz Higher School of Journalism. Dr. Cichocki is the Curriculum Director of the Centre of International Relations in Warsaw since 2000, and since 2004, the Curriculum Director of the European Centre in Natolin as well as Editor-in-chief of the magazine "New Europe. Natolin Review". Dr. Cichocki is a publisher and Editor-in-chief of the "Teologia Polityczna" yearly. He has authored numerous books, essays, articles and dissertations on international relations.

Dr. Cichocki holds a Ph.D. in human sciences in the area of philosophy from IFiS PAN. His dissertation, "Affirmative Conservatism," explored the structure of conservative thinking in the tradition of German political philosophy from political romanticism to Carl Schmitt.

Other books authored by Marek Cichocki include *Power and Remembrance* (2006), *Europe Kidnapped* (2004), and *Poland – European Union, halfway* (2002).
