

MOSHE HIRSCH

Moshe Hirsch is a professor of international law at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem (Law Faculty and Department of International Relations). In the past he served as the Vice Dean of the Law Faculty, Chairperson of the Department of the International Relations, and Director of the International Law Forum.

Prof. Hirsch specializes in international economic law (trade, investment and economic development), and international legal theory. A significant part of his publications involves interdisciplinary research that employs, inter alia, sociological theories, game theory, political economy and political science.
